AN INTERVIEW // WITH CAROL FRYE, BY MARYANN COX

I have come to appreciate each phase of my art as a continuing evolutionary process. A true spiritual connection seems to occur during the painting process giving a special excitement and energy to the production of art that I hope is communicated to the viewer. Over the years my work has grown bolder, freer, richer!...and so have I. **??**

In your website's bio you said you went from creating small realistic paintings to large abstracts and mural size paintings. Could you talk about the process and thinking you went through as that transition took place?

When you are starting out, "smaller" is usually more comfortable. It can make learning new processes, products or techniques less intimidating.

What was the catalyst that started that major shift?

I have always enjoyed experimenting and believe that creativity comes from seeking an answer to the question..."I wonder what would happen if..."

There was a time, not long after moving to Florida that a business owner contacted me..."I love your work! I'd like to hire you to paint a mural for me." At the time my largest paintings were done on 24x36 canvasses.

I became a "cancer survivor" in 1999. After that, not much scared me, so with my art, and other areas of my life I decided to JUST GO FOR IT! What did I have to lose?



What makes the paintings you do now more satisfying than your earlier works?

HAS A STORY

Each step along the way has and continues to provide its own challenges. I find meeting those challenges and/or learning from them a continuously satisfying experience.

In your opinion, what does an artist do to develop his or her own style?

PAINT!!! Everything we create, everything we learn, every piece of art we create helps to form the underlying foundation that supports and encourages us to become the artists we are destined to be.

What is your advice to anyone wanting to be an artist, be it the novice, or one who's been painting for quite a while?

Stay inspired. Join your local art organizations; visit art exhibitions

everywhere you can, including art festivals, museums and galleries. Keep learning. Take classes, workshops, read art

books and magazines. Above all ... paint! Paint!! PAINT!!!
